The Salve Regina College Glee Club, directed by Mrs. Marian W. Van Slyke, will present its annual Christmas concert on Sunday, December 12, at 3:30 p.m. in the Great Hall of Ochre Court.

The program will consist of traditional carols and carols of many lands, as well as the "Exsultavit" from Bach's Magnificat; "I Cieli Immensi" of Marcello; "What Child is This?" sung by a trio accompanied on the guitar.

Featured on the program will also be "Ceremony of Carols" by Britten with harp accompaniment by Joyce Mangler Carlson, who will also present a group of harp solos. Mrs. Carlson is a well-known concert harpist and teacher with degrees from Brown University where at one time she was instructor of Music History. She studied harp with Bernard Zighers of the Boston Symphony; is a member of the R.I. Philharmonic, R.I. Civic Opera, and the Eastern Connecticut and University of Connecticut Orchestras.
