SALVE REGINA COLLEGE ANNOUNCES TUITION INCREASES FOR 1966-1967 THURSDAY JANUARY 6, 1966

An upward adjustment in Salve Regina College

tuition rates, effective in September of 1966, was announced yesterday by Sister Mary Emily, R.S.M., president.

Presently enrolled full-time students will pay

a tuition charge of \$900 per year, an increase of \$100. Full-time entering freshmen in September will pay a tuition of \$1000 per year.

Room and board, currently \$900 per year, will

not be increased.

Sister Mary Emily pointed out that these increases

are the first made at Salve Regina since 1961-62. During this five-year period educational and general costs have been steadily rising, a large increase in the number of lay faculty members has taken place, and student aid has been stepped up. She also pointed out that were it not for the loyal support of the Alumnae, the Guild, the Fathers Council, and the Salve Regina College Gateway Club it would not have been possible to have limited the increases in tuition to these modest amounts.

Sister Mary Emily indicated that the College will continue to do its utmost in cooperating with loan and scholarship programs, both private and governmental, as well as increasing its own generous student aid efforts, so that all available

financial aid may be accessible to Salve Regina students.
