Introduction to the Arts, Mondays at 4:00 p.m., taught by Sister Mary Mercedes, R.S.M.; Art in the Home, Wednesdays at 4:00 p.m., Sister Mary Mercedes; Psychology of Education of Exceptional Children, Mondays at 4:00 p.m., Sister Marie Susanne, R.S.M., (this course is part of the sequence offered by the College for preparing teachers for the mentally retarded); Introduction to Sacred Scripture II, Tuesdays at 4:00 p.m., Sister Mary Columcille, R.S.M., (study of the New Testament); and Meaning of Freedom in Contemporary Thought, Thursdays at 7:00 p.m., Mr. John Corrigan.

Registration will take place in the Registrar's Office, second floor of Ochre Court, on Friday, January 28 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The first session of each class will meet on the day or evening indicated above during the week of January 31, and the classes will run for 16 sessions. All classes will meet in Angelus Hall on the college campus.
