Numbers will include: "The Billboard" (opening selection dedicated to the show world's famous newspaper), "The Sound of Music," "I Love Paris," "My Fair Lady," "Java," "Fascination Cha Cha," "Hello Dolly," "Moon River," "Hey Look Me Over," "Give My Regards to Broadway," a medley of college favorites, and "Arrangers' Holiday"--a Twinkle Winkle.

This will be the Newport Concert Band's second annual appearance on the Salve Regina campus.
