of volunteers of the Rhode Island Mentally Retarded Association, will speak Monday,  
March 15, in Miley Hall on the Salve Regina College campus at 6:00 p.m., at the meeting  
of the Student Nurse Organization. The Student Nurse Organization hopes to establish  
a volunteer program in the mentally retarded field in Newport and Providence.

A second project has recently  
been inaugurated by the College's Student Nurse Organization in the geriatrics  
field in cooperation with the Baptist Home of Rhode Island in Newport.

Thirty-three students from  
nursing education at Salve Regina College have volunteered to give part of their time  
for companionship to some of our elder citizens. With the cooperation of Rev. Lewis  
Hall, the director of the home on Shepard Avenue, they have set up a project of  
"adopted daughters" with the members of the Baptist Home family.
