**SEVENTY-THREE SALVE STUDENTS TO DO
PRACTICE TEACHING IN LOCAL SCHOOLS**

Seventy-three Salve Regina College seniors will arrive on the college campus Monday, Labor Day, September 5, eleven days ahead of their classmates. These students are reporting early in order to begin assignments as student teachers for the fall semester.

They will be assigned to various grades in the elementary and secondary schools of Newport, Middletown, Portsmouth, Providence, and East Providence. This is the first year that Salve Regina student teachers have been so numerous as to permit placement in school systems other than those of Newport and Middletown.

Supervising the student teachers in the secondary schools will be: Dr. Hilda A. Calabro, who joins the Salve faculty this year and who taught previously at Boston College, in foreign languages; Miss Rae K. O'Neill, who comes to Salve Regina this year from Rhode Island College, in history; and Dr. E. William Burrell, the College's director of student teaching.

Sister Mary Annata, R. S. M., will supervise the practice teaching in the elementary grades. And Sister Marie Jeanine, R. S. M., will do the same for the middle grades.
