SALVE PROFESSOR TO ATTEND MEETING OF COUNTRY'S
OLDEST ASSOCIATION OF ENGLISH TEACHERS

Dr. E. William Burrell, a member of the English and the Education Departments at Salve Regina College and Coordinator of Student Teaching Programs at the college, will attend the Fall Conference of the New England Association of Teachers of English at Charter House, Portland, Maine, October 7-8.

The association, the oldest organization of English teachers in the country, was founded in 1901. It has a total membership of over 1300 English teachers principally from high schools and colleges.

Dr. Burrell, who is president of the Rhode Island Council of Teachers of English and a director of the National Council of Teachers of English, is a member of the executive board of the New England Association. During the two-day session he will chair a meeting of the finance committee and attend the executive board meeting.
