MEMORIAL LECTURE SERIES
OPENS AT SALVE REGINA

William J. Leonard, S. J., one of America's foremost liturgists and member of long standing of the National Liturgical Conference, will be the opening speaker of Salve Regina College's Mother Hilda Miley Memorial Lecture Series Monday, October 10, in Ochre Court at 7:30 p. m. The subject of his lecture is: "Life between Liturgies: an investigation of Christian worship as both the peak of Christian living and its inspiration." The public is invited.

Professor of Theology at Boston College, Father Leonard is the author of innumerable articles in secular and religious journals and of the distinguished "New Horizons in Catholic Worship."

The lecture series is opening its first year on the Newport campus. Held in honor of the late Mother Mary Hilda Miley, a founder of the college and its president for sixteen years, the purpose of the series is to bring timely and timeless issues into focus for the college community and the general public.

Among the speakers scheduled this fall are:

Dr. John T. Noonan, Jr., author of the prize winning Contraception: A History of Its Treatment by the Catholic Theologians and Canonists (Harvard University Press: 1965) and expert invite at deliberations of the Vatican Council Commission on Birth Control, October 20 at 7:30 p. m. ; Dr. Paul vanK Thomson, Vice President of Academic Affairs at Providence College, who will speak on Byron and the Satanic School of Poetry, October 27 at 7:15.
