**SALVE STUDENT TEACHERS REPORT FOR
DUTY AT SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT R.I.**

Nearly one hundred Salve Regina student teachers return to campus on Labor Day, September 4. Assignments of ninety-two seniors have been made to various public and parochial schools throughout the state. This number represents an increase of more than 25% over last year.

Forty-six elementary student teachers will be in Barrington, East Providence, Middletown, Newport, Portsmouth, and Providence, and an additional seven Sisters of Mercy have been assigned to schools in Bristol, Newport, and Pawtucket. Sister Mary Jeannine, R.S.M., Sister Mary Annata, R.S.M., and Miss Rae K. O'Neill will supervise these students.

As the result of an expanded program in Special Education at Salve Regina, twelve students have been assigned to schools in Middletown, Newport, and Portsmouth. Sister Kathryn Mary, R.S.M., is the director of the special education program.

Secondary school assignments total twenty-seven in Barrington, Middletown, Newport, Portsmouth, Providence, and Tiverton. Dr. E. William Burrell, Chairman of the Department of Education, also directs these students assisted by faculty members.
