**PULITZER PRIZE WINNING POET
TO READ AT SALVE REGINA**

W. D. Snodgrass, Pulitzer-prize winning poet, will be presented by Salve Regina College Fine Arts 67 Thursday, November 30 at 8 p.m. in Ochre Court on the college campus. Mr. Snodgrass will read from and comment on his poetry.

Presently associate professor of English at Wayne State University, the poet is a protege of Robert Lowell who described his work as "beautifully perfect and a break-through for modern poetry."

His academic career has included appointments at Cornell, the University of Rochester, the Morehead Writers' Conference and the Antioch Writers' Conference. His honors include the Ingram-Merrill award, the Longview Award, the Guinness Poetry Award and a special citation by the Poetry Society of America. His volume of poems, Heart's Needle, earned him the Pulitzer Prize in 1960.
