A Portuguese Evening will be celebrated at Salve Regina College on Monday, December 4 at 7:30 p.m. in Ochre Court. Principal speaker of the evening will be Mr. Manuel Oliveria, Executive Secretary of the Portuguese American Cultural Society of New York who will speak on "Portugal: Past and Present."

A program of musical entertainment will feature the choir of Jesus Savior Church of Newport in Portuguese selections. Miss Cheryl Girr, member of the Sophomore Class of Salve Regina, will perform a typical Portuguese dance, and a group of students from the University of Coimbra will present guitar selections and sing "fados." A social hour will follow.
