George Szpinalski, violinist, and Robert Wallenborn,

pianist, will give a violin and piano recital Tuesday, February 6 at 8 p.m. in Ochre Court of Salve Regina College. The program, consisting of works by Brahms, Szymanowski and Saint-Saens, is open to the public.

Now a resident of Newport, Polish born Mr. Spzinalski studied at the Imperial Conservatory in Moscow, the Conservatory of Music in Warsaw and the Modern Institute of the Violin in Paris under such masters as Moscow's Hrimaly and Paris' Lucien Capet. Having made his American debut in Chicago, his musical activity in this country has centered mainly in the mid-west where he has been on the faculty of the Universities of Chicago and Wisconsin and a member of the Chicago Symphony.

Mr. Szpinalski's interpretations, highly acclaimed by both European and American critics, are rendered on his "Nachez" Stradivarius.

A concert pianist of renown in Europe and America, Mr. Wallenborn studied under Rudolph Ganz at the University of Chicago, Max Pauer in Leipzig and George Bertram in Berlin. He has been soloist with the leading orchestras in Europe and has appeared as co-artist with such as singers Rose Bampton, Helen Jepson and Richard Bonelli, and violinists Szpinalski, Roman Totenberg and Mischa Mischakoff. He is presently artist-in-residence at Washington University in St. Louis.
