on the American political scene, will lecture at Salve Regina College Thursday, March 7
at 7:30 p.m. in the amphitheaire of the O'Hare Academic Center. He will speak on the
New Student Left. The public is invited.

Author of <u>The Alienated Voter</u>, <u>The Compleat</u>

Politician and <u>Kennedy Campaigning</u>, Mr. Levin is presently professor of political science at Boston University. <u>The New York Times</u> referred to Kennedy Campaigning as "a genuine addition to the literature of American politics."

For the past year, Professor Levin has been writing a book on student radical politics. Entitled The New Student Left, it will be published in the fall.

In his address, Professor Levin will analyze the student radicals' interpretation of American economic problems and the prospects of a new radical party on grass roots coalition of the poor.

In addition to analyzing these problems, Mr. Levin will also comment on the life style of student radicals, why student radicalism developed in the sixties and what are the prospects of the New Student Left.
