Sister Maureen Dietz, R.S.M., faculty member of the Science Education Department at Salve Regina College, Newport, R. I., recently received a Doctoral Degree in Science at the University of Pennsylvania. After completing her B.S. at Creighton University, Sister Maureen Dietz continued her education at the University of Pennsylvania where she received an N.S.F. Fellowship, a Teaching-Research Fellowship and an N.S. F. Faculty Grant. Her research in problem solving in collaboration with Dr. Kenneth George has resulted in the Problem Solving Skills Test which is currently being considered for publication by Educational Testing Service of Princeton University.
