A member of the faculty of Salve Regina College, Newport, R. I., has been selected to participate in the Summer Institute for mathematics Teachers at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Sister Margaret Murphy, R.S. M., will represent the mathematics department in this program to be held June 4 to July 14. The director of the Institute, Dr. Robert P. Valker, indicated that the competition has been unusually keen and that only 31 of more than 300 applicants could be supported.

The content of the Institute will be centered on the study and applications of Linear Algebra and Differential Equations. Dr. Eenjamin J. Martin from Morehouse College and Dr. Ancel Mewborn from the University of North Carolina will conduct the courses, and Dr. J. Ernest V ilkins of Howard University will be the guest lecturer.

Sister Margaret has taught at Salve Regina for two years. She was selected on the basis of her mathematics background and on her high potential for implementing science improvement within the department.
