ACI and Police Officers To Receive Course Completion Certificates

Sister Mary Christopher, R.S.M., president of Salve Regina College, will join

Federal prison officials on Wednesday evening, December 20, 1972, to present 42 police

officers and correctional personnel with course completion certificates. The ceremony will

take place at 6 p.m., at the Adult Correctional Institutions, Cranston.

Francis J. Foley, Deputy Warden at the ACI, who initiated extending law enforcement training within the prison walls, has indicated that 37 police officers and 11 correctional personnel have completed the "Jail Officers Training Course," in phase one of the ongoing program, affiliated since its start with Salve Regina.

Thus far 23 correctional personnel are signed up to continue with phase two of this unusual approach to higher education for law enforcement officials. Police officers will be able to register for further courses from January 3 to 19, 1973.

The Federal officials attending are Mr. William Carlton, community services officer, Bureau of Prisons and Mr. Thomas Muddiman, federal probation officer for the Providence area. Mr. Carlton will, at the same time, inspect the Rhode Island facility, as it is used periodically for Federal prisoners.
