Roten Galleries Exhibit at Salve Regina

An exhibition and sale of original graphic art by contemporary and old master artists will take place at O'Hare Academic Center, Salve Regina College, Newport, on Monday, April 2, 1973. Arranged by the Ferdinand Roten Galleries of Baltimore, Maryland, the exhibition will be on display from 11:00 a. m. to 8:00 p. m., on the ocean front campus.

Included in the exhibition will be over 1,000 original etchings, lithographs, and woodcuts by artists such as Picasso, Chagall, Miro, Dali, Goya, Renoir, Kollwitz, and many others including contemporary American, European, and Japanese printmakers.
