Many summer students at colleges across the nation will find their work "Greek" to them. However, at Salve Regina College in Newport, this is as it should be. Salve Regina is one of the few colleges in this part of the country offering two courses in Greek during the Summer Session starting June 24.

Sister Mary Rose, of Mt. Mary Convent, Fall River, will teach a course in Intermediate Greek and one in Greek Literature.

Of particular interest to teachers in this area are the two unique education courses also being offered by visiting faculty members.

Sister Mary Rosanne, diocesan school supervisor, will teach "Individualized Mathematics, Level One." This course is specifically designed for Grades I through III, and will stress new procedures for the individualization of instruction and the use of the new number tool, the Numeraid or the American abacus.

Mrs. Evelyn Curley, a teacher in the Middletown School Department, will instruct in "Teaching Reading Through Phonics," emphasizing the Spaulding Method of teaching reading.

DiPippo, Salve Regina, "Diet Therapy," by Sister Mariel, Salve Regina, "American Government," Sister Mary Harold, St. Francis Xavier Convent, Providence; "Modern Abstract Algebra," Sister Mary Rose Agnes, Salve Regina; and "History of Social Thought," Sister Mary Norbert, Salve Regina.

All courses carry 3 semester hours of credit except Genetics and Qualitative Organic Analysis which are 4 semester hour courses. Pre-registration by mail will be accepted through June 22, with registration in person at 9am. on June 24, the day classes start.

Classes will continue through August 2.

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
