

EDUCATORS TO MEET AT SALVE REGINA THURSDAY TO CONSIDER SCHOOL DROPOUT PROBLEM IN STATE AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR HIGHER EDUCATION FOR NEGROES

The implementation of a plan of action to seek immediate means of halting school dropouts in Rhode Island will be a major concern of a group of educators meeting tomorrow at Salve Regina College in Newport. Plans to increase educational opportunities of higher education for Negroes will likewise be discussed.

initial meeting of these educators held two weeks ago at the University of Rhode Island, which was an outgrowth of President Kennedy's conference last month with national leaders in education on equal opportunities for Negroes.
