Sister Mary Rosalia, R.S.M., Dean, and Sister Mary Venard, R.S.M., Business Manager of Salve Regina College, this week have been attending the Annual Meeting of the American Council on Education at the Mayflower Hotel, Washington, D. C.

Following this, they will represent the college at the Academic Convocation in Emmitsburg, Maryland, October 5, honoring the Beatification of Elizabeth Ann Seton, foundress of St. Joseph's College in that city.

While in Washington, Sister Mary Rosalia also participated in a meeting of the College Commission of the Sisters of Mercy of the Union, of which commission she is vice chairman.

On October 4 and 5, Mr. George L. McKim of Salve Regina's Education Department, and its director of secondary school student teaching, is representing the college at the meeting of the New England Teacher Preparation Association being held in Boston at the Somerset Hotel.
