**SALVE REGINA COLLEGE ANNOUNCES  
1965-66 FACULTY APPOINTMENTS**

Sister Mary Emily, president of Salve Regina College, Newport, today announced the new faculty appointments for 1965-66.

Total faculty and administration at the College this year will number 82: 49 Sisters of Mercy, 3 priests, 19 laywomen, and 11 laymen.

Rev. John P. Reilly, Ph.D., most recently assistant editor of THE PROVIDENCE VISITOR will come to Salve Regina as Chairman of the Division of Theology and Philosophy. The former Dominican chaplains, Rev. John T. Dittoe and Rev. Michael McCaffrey, have been transferred to colleges operated by their own Order.

Teaching Theology will be Sister Mary Thecla, coming from Holy Family High School, New Bedford, Mass., M.A. degree from Providence College; Sister Mary Magdala, from Bishop Feehan High School, North Attleboro, Mass., M.A., Providence College; Rev. Harry Marchosky, Candidate Ph.D. degree, of the Diocese of Quebec, who will also act as Chaplain of the College; and, part-time, Rev. Joseph D. Shenick, S.T.M., of St. Augustin's parish, Newport.

New members of the English Department are

Dr. E. William Burrell, formerly of Classical High School, Providence, who has his A.B. from Fordham University, his M.A. from Boston University, and his doctorate from the Harvard Graduate School of Education; Mrs. Dorothy Troendle, with previous teaching experience at Rhode Island School of Design, University of Rhode Island, and Wheaton, who received her A.B. degree from RISD and her M.A. and Ph.D. from Brown University; and Sister Mary Loretto, who received her Master's degree from Catholic University of America, has done additional graduate work at Notre Dame, and has been teaching in the college program at the Sisters of Mercy Novitiate in Cumberland, R. I. Dr. Burrell will be Director of Secondary Education, replacing Professor George McKim who retired last year. Sister Mary Loretto will also teach Theology.

Joseph M. Eerman, Cand. Ph.D., Brown, and a Phi Beta Kappa at the University of Florida where he did his undergraduate work; and Sister Patricia Marie, a graduate of Salve Regina and a Candidate for the Master's degree at Brown, formerly teaching at St. Edward's School, Pawtucket, R.I., are joining the Mathematics department.

Robert J. McKenna, Cand. Ph.D., Catholic University, a management analyst at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Washington, D.C., and a special assistant to Senator Claiborne Pell, will teach Social Studies and Philosophy. He received his M.A. degree from Catholic University and his A.B. from Brown. Sister Mary Patrician, Cand. M.A., Eoston College, who has been teaching at St. Mary's Academy, Bay View, Providence, will join the History Department at Salve Regina.
