<u>Two Faces of Woman</u> will be the theme of a double feature film bill and critique at Salve Regina College, Wednesday (Oct. 28).

The program, a bonus offering of the current FLICKS '70 series at the women's college, will include two international award-winning films, <u>The Pumpkin Eater</u> and <u>A Taste of Honey</u>, and a critique conducted by Rev. Dominic Rover, O.P., Providence College film specialist.

The public is invited to attend. Admission will be free for FLICKS '70 subscribers, and \$1.00 for non-subscribers.

<u>The Pumpkin Eater</u>, a story of a woman plagued by the knowledge that her husband, whom she adores, is a flagrant and promiscuous adulterer, will be screened at 4 p.m. in the Twombley-Burden Room, O'Hare Academic Center. The Harold Pinter story stars Anne Bancroft, James Mason, and Peter Finch.

<u>A Taste of Honey</u>, starring Rita Tushingham, deals with the mystery of woman, what she is looking for, and where she finds fulfillment and pain in her exploration of love. The film will be screened at 7 p.m. in the Twombley-Burden Room.

Father Rover, who opened the FLICKS series earlier this month with a keynote address on "Man's Vision of Himself," will lead an open discussion and critique of the two films at approximately 8:30 p.m., also in the Twombley-Burden Room.

The FLICKS '70 series, Focusing Life in Cinema, Keynotes, and Symposia, will continue its five-part study of "The Dimensions of Man" through the medium of film with programs scheduled for November, February, March, and April.
