#### SALVE AND RAYTHEON PARTNERS IN NEW COURSE

Salve Regina College has teamed up with Raytheon, Inc., to offer Island residents a special introductory course on computers. Classes will be held at Raytheon in order to use their computer facilities, and four college credits will be awarded for the program, according to Dr. William Burrell, dean of the college.

"The purpose of the course is to familiarize people with the computer," said Dr. Burrell. "You don't need prior experience with computers to participate. All you need is at least three years of high school math and a desire to learn about computers. The course is ideal for managers who want to know how to use the computer as a management tool, or for people who want a background in computer training."

The course begins Thursday, February 14, and runs until the middle of May. It's held every Tuesday and Thursday evening from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. Topics covered in the course include computer systems, introduction to programming, program structure and languages and modeling and problem solving.
