FOUR SALVE STUDENTS TO JOIN
SENATOR PELL AND REPRESENTATIVE TIERNAN IN WASHINGTON

Four students from Salve Regina College have been selected to serve as student interns in the Washington offices of Senator Claiborne Pell and Representative Robert O. Tiernan during the week of March 11.

Mr. Robert J. McKenna, director of college and community relations at Salve and coordinator of the internship program, announced the nominated students. They are Jane Williams of Providence; Toni Schell of Wilton, Conn.; Mariadonna McCarthy of Avon-by-the-Sea, New Jersey; and Valerie Berg of Portsmouth, R. I.

Ms. Williams and Ms. Schell will intern in the office of Representative Robert O. Tiernan while Ms. McCarthy and Ms. Berg will intern with Senator Claiborne Pell. As interns, the students will serve as staff assistants for the week. Additionally, they will visit the Supreme Court, the White House, the House of Representatives and the Senate to observe various branches of the government in action.
