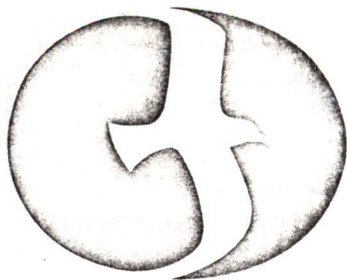

SALVE'S READER'S THEATER PRESENTS "BRONZE SHADES"

The Salve Regina College Reader's Theater will present "Bronze Shades" by Burrows Younkin March 22-24 at 8:00 p.m. in O'Hare Academic Center. All performances are open to the public and admission is \$1.00.

"Bronze Shades" is a poetic compilation of Younkin's memories from several months of war. Younkin, now a PhD candidate in Biochemistry at URI, will be present to read selections from his other works and to meet with the audience.

Mr. Robert Kulo, director of Reader's Theater at Salve, adapted "Bronze Shades" for Reader's Theater, a dramatic art form in which the "reader" interprets literature for the audience without the aid of stage props, special lighting effects, etc. The readers talk directly to the audience and not to other actors as in traditional drama. This makes for more direct audience participation because they are part of the drama and they have to imagine what the setting is, what the characters look like and so on.

Readers for "Bronze Shades" are Denise McCarthy, 1st narrator; Pamela Sinyei, 2nd narrator; Paul Preuit, lieutenant; Franklyn Johnson, colonel; Don Bechtel, sergeant; and Neil McEvoy, corpsman.
