IRISH FORTNIGHT CONTINUES

The Irish Fortnight, a series of talks on Irish culture, continues at Salve Regina College on Monday, March 25. Dr. John Murphy will speak on "The Irish Response to European Socialism" at 8:00 p.m. in Ochre Court. Admission is free.

Dr. Murphy, an expert on Modern Irish History from the 17th to the 20th Century, is presently chairman of the history department at University College in Cork. He is the author of the soon-to-be-published The Age of de Valera and also, Desmond Studies, an inquiry into the origins of English plantation policy. He recently edited a series of lectures concerning "Religion and Irish Society," for the Irish national radio system. Dr. Murphy's presentation will be moderated by Mr. Donald Gibbs, librarian at Newport's Redwood Library.
