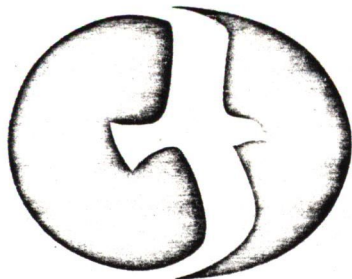

TWO JAZZ GROUPS AT SALVE

Salve Regina College will present a joint concert by Jazz Ltd. and the Mike Renzi Trio on Thursday, April 25 at 8 p.m. in ^{Ochre Court} O'Hare Academic Center. WHBH Radio, the national educational radio network, will tape the performance for a 90-minute special.

Both groups are considered to be among the top jazz trios in New England. The Salve concert will be the first time the two groups have played together in a joint concert. They will perform original compositions and works by the country's leading jazz composers.

Jazz Ltd. is a Rhode Island based trio that has been together for eight years. The group has played many local clubs and some of the country's major night clubs such as the Americana in Miami Beach. Mac Chrupcala leads the group on piano with Richard Haddocks on bass and Jack Warner on drums.

Mike Renzi is the pianist for his trio. Backing him up are Artie Cabral on drums and Bob Peterutti on bass.

According to Glenn Giuttari, director of music at Salve, the concert will be somewhat of a "first". He says it is unusual for two jazz pianists like Renzi and Chrupcala to play together simultaneously.

Tickets for the concert are available at the door. Admission is \$3.00.
