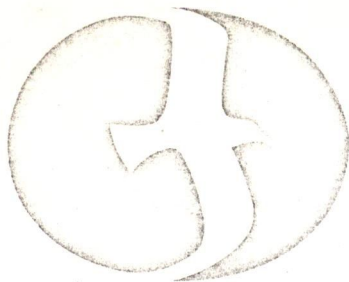

The 24th annual commencement of Salve Regina College will be held this Monday, May 27, at 11:00 a.m. Two hundred and sixty-three students will receive degrees making Monday's graduation the largest in the history of the college. College officials also expect the ceremony to be the final commencement where undergraduate degrees only are awarded. The 25th commencement next year will include Master's degree recipients from Salve's new graduate program.

Sister Lucille McKillop, president of Salve Regina College, and Dr. William Burrell, dean of the college, will present 71 Associate's degrees, 75 Bachelor of Arts degrees and 110 Bachelor of Science degrees at the commencement exercises. Mr. Malcolm S. Knowles, professor of education at Boston University and a leading authority on adult education in the United States, will deliver the commencement address.

Other distinguished guests will be the Honorable J. Joseph Garrahy, Lieutenant Governor of Rhode Island, Newport Mayor Humphrey J. Donnelly III and the Most Reverend Louis E. Gelineau, Bishop of the Diocese of Providence. Lt. Governor Garrahy will bring the greeting of the State, Mayor Donnelly will bring the greetings of the City and Bishop Gelineau will give the invocation and benediction.

Mr. Roger Aubin, consultant for teacher certification, Rhode Island State Department of Education, will award teaching certificates to those graduates in the education program. Leo J. Bottari, professor of Biology, will act as Marshall and lead the academic procession.
