On July 6, C. Alexander Peloquin, internationally-renowned composer and chorale director, will offer a concert of America's greatest hymns, as a reflection of American experience. Featured will be the first presentation in Rhode Island of his Bicentennial composition, "A Prayer for US".

From July 11-13, a Black Heritage Trilogy is planned. Members of Black People Moving will offer a program of readings and poetry on July 11. This collection of poetry, sermons, and statements surveys the Black experience in America, from the 1600's to the present.
