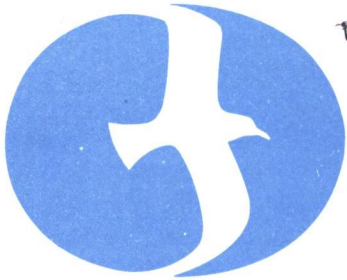

Anyone wishing to study for academic credit can take the four-credit course, "The Process of Nation-Building: Challenges to Unity 1776-1976".
