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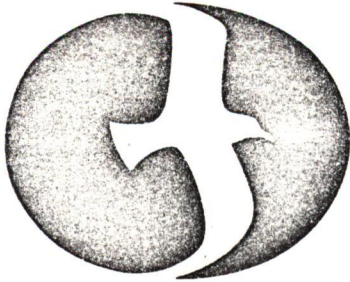

CHILDREN'S ART CLASSES AT SALVE

Children from five to fifteen will get a chance to draw, paint, and work with clay when the fall children's art classes begin Saturday morning, October 18th at Salve Regina College. On eight consecutive Saturday mornings from 10:00 a. m. to noon, children will study the fundamentals of visual expression under the guidance of Salve Regina Art Instructor Sister Michaeline Lewandowski and George Laurie, a graduate student in the College's art education program.

"Each child will be encouraged to explore his or her ability to communicate what he or she sees, thinks and feels through individual expression," says Sr. Michaeline, "and although the children will be divided into four age groups, each child will receive individualized attention in keeping with his or her interests and ability."

Classes will be held in Mercy Hall, the College Arts Center, and will be divided into sections for 5-6 year olds, 7-9 year olds, 10-12 year olds, and teenagers from 13 to 15.
