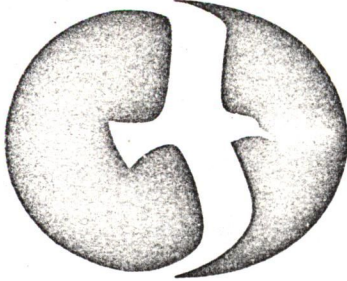

"IN SEARCH OF DRACULA" AT SALVE REGINA COLLEGE

Is there any truth to the legend of Dracula? Was Dracula a real Count or a vampire created by the talents of Bram Stoker and Bela Lugosi? These questions and others will be answered Tuesday, November 11th when Dr. Radu Florescu talks on "In Search of Dracula" at Salve Regina College.

Dr. Florescu, a professor of East European and Balkan History at Boston College, is a direct descendant of an ancient Rumanian family that traces its heritage to Dracula's times and is said to have witnessed Count Dracula's horrors. Author of the book In Search of Dracula, Dr. Florescu will also discuss the mysterious things that happened to him and to co-author Raymond McNally when they attempted to prove the existence of the real Count Dracula.

His talk, sponsored by the Salve Regina Speakers Committee, begins at 8:00 p. m. in O'Hare Academic Center. Admission is \$1.00.
