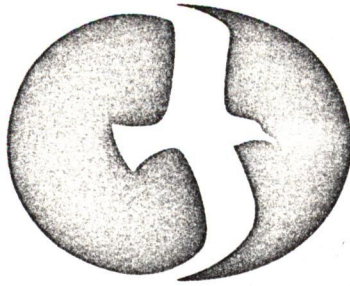

During the five-day internship the girls will visit the White House, the Supreme Court, and the Congress, attend committee hearings and assist Senator Pell on various projects.

The girls were selected for the program on the basis of their academic records and interest in political affairs. According to Salve Regina History Professor and Internship Coordinator, Dr. Robert J.
