KEYBOARD SONATA CONCERT

Mr. Steven Massoud, a member of the piano faculty at Salve Regina, The Newport College, will give a piano recital on Wednesday, March 2 at 12:45 p.m. in Ochre Court. This will be one of a series of noon-day concerts which the college holds and which are open to the public. Mr. Massoud will perform Keyboard Sonatas by Domenico Scarlatti. Mr. Scarlatti was a contemporary of Bach and Handel.

Mr. Massoud studied at Boston University with Dr. Alfred Kanwischer and Anthony di Bonaventura. He holds a Master of Music Degree from New England Conservatory, where he held a Teaching Fellowship and studied with Russell Sherman. Mr. Massoud was Guild Judge for the 1976 National Guild of Piano Teachers Auditions,
