### TWENTY-SEVENTH COMMENCEMENT

May 22, 1977

Over three hundred students will be awarded degrees at the College's twenty-seventh commencement on Sunday, May 22, 1977. Thirty-six students will be awarded Master of Arts degrees, three students will be awarded Bachelor of Arts and Science degrees, one hundred and sixty-seven will be awarded Bachelor of Science degrees, forty-five will be awarded Bachelor of Arts degrees and fifty will be awarded Associate of Arts degrees. There will be three honorary degree recipients: Mr. Charles D. O'Connell, Jr., Vice Chairman of Salve Regina's Board of Trustees, Vice President and Dean of Students at the University of Chicago, will also be the Commencement speaker.

The Honorable Florence K. Murray, Associate Judge of the Rhode Island Superior Court. She was a member of the Salve Regina Advisory Board which was the forerunner of the present Board of Trustees.

The third recipient is Admiral Stansfield Turner, former President of the Naval War College and the recent appointee of President Carter as Director of the Central Intelligence Agency.

A Master of Arts degree in Human Development will be awarded posthumously to Mr. Stephen C. O'Rourke. The widow of the late member of the Rhode Island House of Representatives from Newport will receive the degree in her husband's name.
