TWO NAMED TO THE OFFICE OF VICE PRESIDENT OF SALVE REGINA COLLEGE

Sister Lucille McKillop, President of Salve Regina, The Newport College announced the promotions of Dr. William Burrell to the office of Vice President and Dr. Sheila Megley, R.S.M. to the office of Vice President.

Dr. William Burrell joined the Salve Regina College faculty in 1965. He holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Fordham, a Master of Arts Degree from Boston University and a Doctor of Education Degree from Harvard University. Dr. Burrell, a Professor of English and Education, will continue as Dean of the Graduate College and Dean of the Faculty. In these capacities he holds membership on the Administrative Council of the College. Dr. Burrell has served in several administrative positions since coming to SRC. Dr. Burrell has been Director of the Secondary Teacher Education Program, Chairman of the Education Department, Chairman of the Educational Policies and Curriculum Committee.

Dr. Burrell has been active in many professional associations. He has served on the Governor's Advisory Commission on Educational Television, is a former Director of the Rhode Island Civil Liberties Union, a Past President of the Rhode Island Council of Teachers of English and is a Past President of the

Dr. Burrell presently serves on the Rhode Island Committee on the Humanities, on the Advisory Committee Teachers Certification for the State of Rhode Island and on the Program Budget Panels for the United Way Agencies. He currently holds membership in several scholarly and professional organizations.

Dr. Burrell is married to the former Barbara Mary O Connor. The Burrells have two children, Jason Edwin and Mary Elizabeth. They live in Newport.

Dr. Sheila Megley, R.S.M. has been at Salve Regina College since 1974, as Dean of Students and as Academic Dean. Sister Sheila Megley graduated with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Mathematics from Rosary College, River Forest, Illinois. She holds a Master of Arts Degree in Theology from St. Xavier College, Chicago and a second Master of Arts Degree in English from the University of Chicago; her Doctor of Philosophy Degree is in English from the University of Nebraska. Sister Sheila Megley will continue in her role as Academic Dean and Dean of Students. She begins her fourth year as a member of the Administrative Council of the College.

Before coming to SRC, Sister Sheila Megley was on the faculty of the Department of English at the University of Nebraska. She also taught at St. Xavier College, Barat College and Marygrove College. She served in administrative positions as Director of Placement, Director of Financial Aid, Director of Residence, Assistant Dean of Students at St. Xavier College; and as Assistant Director of Upward Bound programs at Barat College in Lake Forest, Illinois. It was Sister Sheila Megley who directed the research and the report on Equal Access/Equal Opportunity for the Board of Regents of the State of Rhode Island in 1975-76.
