NEWPORT HIGHLIGHTED IN SALVE'S SUMMER OFFERINGS

Registration began the first week of April for the two 1978 Summer Sessions at the Newport College-Salve Regina. The first five week session will run from May 24 - June 29 and the second session begins July 5 and finishes August 11.

In addition to the more than 100 undergraduate and graduate courses offered during the Intersession and Summer Session, the college will feature over 30 short term educational workshops.

Of particular interest to the Newport area are those workshops offered by the History Department. "Newport Through Visual Perception," "Oral History," and "Genealogy" will use this historical city as a setting for the theory and experience of developing an understanding of personal and social roots.

John Hagnaur, associated with the John Stevens Shop, will offer a two week workshop in the study and practice of lettering in its inscriptional forms. The student will combine theory

with hands-on experience. A self-carved personal initial will be the creation of each participant.

Sketching in Newport: 19th Century Mansions will also be offered by the College's Art Department. Students will work outdoors on site at Ochre Court and other famous 19th century Newport mansions. In addition, interior motifs of the Beaux Arts period will be examined.

Visitors to Newport as well as the year-long resident may enjoy "A Newport Experience" - a morning lecture series beginning June 29 and running to August 18, Monday to Friday at 9:00 a.m. The lecture series will explore the rich historical and social traditions of Newport. Lectures given by well known Newporters will introduce the listener to Newport's political heritage; social ethnic and religious diversity; physical development; culture; fine arts and architectural splendor. Following the lecture each morning will be a guided tour of the first floor of Ochre Court, the college's administration building.
