SISTER LUCILLE MCKILLOP ANNOUNCES ADMINISTRATIVE APPOINTMENTS

Sister Lucille McKillop, President of The Newport College-Salve Regina, has announced administrative changes and appointments at the College. Sister Sheila Megley, recently named Vice President and Academic Dean, has resigned her post as Dean of Students in order to devote her full energies to her new responsibilities.

Reverend James Healy, C.S.Sp., until now Director of Campus Ministry and Chaplain and Associate Dean of Students, has been appointed Dean of Students.

Reverend Edward Kelly, C.S.Sp., will replace Father Healy as Dean of Campus Ministry and Chaplain. Father Kelly is an Associate Professor of Religious Studies at the College. He holds a Master of Divinity Degree from St. Mary's Seminary in Norwalk, Connecticut, a Master of Arts from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and a Master of Arts Degree from Catholic Theological Union in Chicago. Father Kelly was a missionary in Tanzania, East Africa for twenty-two years. During that time he taught at the Senior Seminary of the Diocese of Moshi, Tanzania; he taught and was Headmaster at the Catechetical Teacher Training Center of

the Diocese of Arusha, Tanzania. He was the Vicar General of Arusha Diocese for ten years. Father Kelly was the leader of a three man team to establish Holy Ghost Fathers' first missionary undertaking in Ethiopia.

These administrative appointments harmonize with recent modifications enacted in student government at the College. The Student Congress voted to dissolve itself in order to be replaced by two distinct bodies, an Academic Student Senate and a Student Life Senate. Students elected and appointed in each area will be able to work directly in close cooperation with the appropriate dean.

One of Father Healy's first decisions as the new Dean of Students was to appoint Miss Diane Caplin as Director of Student Activities. Miss Caplin, a Portsmouth native and graduate of the University of Rhode Island, has been employed by the College during the past year as coach of women's basketball and softball. Her coaching work will be combined with her new duties as Director of Student Activities.
