FORMER PRIME MINISTER OF IRELAND TO SPEAK

The Honorable Jack Lynch, former prime minister of the Republic of Ireland, will give a lecture on "The U.S. and Ireland: Some Aspects of their Interrelationship" at The Newport College - Salve Regina, Ochre Court, on Friday, October 17 at 8:30 p.m. The lecture is open to the public and free of charge.

The Honorable Jack Lynch served as prime minister of the Republic of Ireland from 1966 until this year. Formerly, the Irish statesman served the Republic in various capacities as minister for education, minister for industry and commerce, and minister for finance.
