LECTURES AND FILMS AT THE NEWPORT COLLEGE - SALVE REGINA
EXPLORE A LIFE OF FAITH TODAY

"What Does It Mean To Be Christian In Today's World?" will begin a three-part lecture series exploring relevant aspects of a life of faith today on Sunday, October 19 at 2:30 p.m., Ochre Court, The Newport College - Salve Regina. The program is sponsored by the College's office of Campus Ministry and Spiritual Development.

The Rev. Robert Knapp, who has taught at the Gregorian in Rome and is academic dean at Pope John ~~XXIII~~ Seminary in Weston, Mass., will be the lecturer. He holds a doctorate in sacramental theology from the Angelicum in Rome.

The second part of the series, "Prayer: Call and Response to a Covenant Relationship" will be held on Nov. 9 and the final part, "New Testament Love; Jesus the Focal Point in History" will be held Dec. 7. Both these sessions will be at 2:30 p.m. in Ochre Court at the College.
