SALVE STUDENT AWARDED FULBRIGHT
FOR GRADUATE STUDY IN POLAND

Joyce H. Kubinec, a politics major at The Newport College - Salve Regina, Newport, R.I., has been awarded a Fulbright Travel Grant for graduate study in Poland during the 1980-81 academic year. She was selected by the 12-member, U.S. President-appointed Board of Foreign Scholarships of the Institute of International Education in New York City.

Kubinec's award is a joint U.S. government/Polish government grant to study at the Institute of Civil

Law, University of Warsaw. She will investigate the effects of the 1939-45 German occupation of Poland on the international contracts of Marconi Wireless Ltd., a Warsaw business firm. Kubinec plans to become an international lawyer with a specialization in Eastern European public and private law.

The Fulbright Program is part of the U.S. government's educational and cultural exchange program administered by the International Communication Agency. Kubinec is one of approximately 320 American students selected for Fulbright grants this year. She begins her studies in Poland September 4, 1980.

Kubinec was an active member of the Student Academic Senate at The Newport College and co-editor of the student yearbook, Regina Maris. She is a member of Sigma Phi Sigma, national honor society of the Sisters of Mercy, and is listed in the 1978-79 edition of Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities.

Kubinec has lived in Czechoslovakia and traveled extensively in England, Wales, Greece and Turkey. She is fluent in Czechoslovakian.

While a student at Salve, Ms. Kubinec studied under the guidance of Sr. Ann Nelson, R.S.M., chairman of the politics department. She is the daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Richard Kubinec of Eastchester, NY.
