VICE PRESIDENT FOR INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT NAMED  
AT THE NEWPORT COLLEGE - SALVE REGINA

Sister M. Therese Antone, R.S.M. has been named to the new position of vice president for institutional advancement at The Newport College - Salve Regina by Sister Lucille McKillop, president.

Sister Therese has served as director of development at The Newport College since 1976, coordinating a comprehensive development program involving alumni, parents, corporations, foundations, government agencies and community leaders. She is a member of the President's Administrative Council and has served on the Board of Trustees since 1973. She is also an assistant professor of mathematics.

As vice president for institutional advancement, Sister Therese will be in charge of planning, coordinating and supervising College development, communications and public relations programs.

Prior to joining Salve, Sister Therese was director of finance for the Sisters of Mercy. She also served as educational director for the R.S.M. secondary schools in Rhode Island, Massachusetts and Central America.

From 1969 to 1973 Sister Therese was principal of Bishop Feehan High School (Attleboro, Mass.), an 800-student regional high school. She founded the Bishop Feehan High School Foundation, the first Parent's Association and helped to obtain the school's first accreditation.

Sister Therese has held various teaching positions on the junior high, high school, and college levels. She taught junior high and high school mathematics and religion in the Diocese of Fall River (Mass.) and served as an instructor of mathematics at Mercy College in Cumberland, R.I.

Her educational background includes a B.A. from The Newport College - Salve Regina, an M.A. in mathematics from Villanova University, and an M.Ed. in administration, planning and social policy from Harvard University. Currently, she has completed requirements for an Ed.D. in Administration and planning from Harvard University and will be awarded this degree in the fall. Sister Therese is also a member of the Phi Delta Kappa national honor society.

Sister Therese has served as a member of the accrediting team and the committee for evaluating the accrediting process of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. She also served on the Advisory Panel of the Diocesan School Board in Fall River (Mass.), the Board of Governors of the Southeastern Massachusetts Conference of High Schools, and the United Way Budget committee in Rhode Island.

Her memberships include the Association of Governing Boards of Universities and Colleges, Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, Mercy Higher Education Colloquium, American Association of University Professors, American Association of University Administrators, and Council for Advancement and Support of Education representative.
