LARGEST NUMBER OF NEW, FULL-TIME FACULTY
JOIN THE NEWPORT COLLEGE - SALVE REGINA

Twelve new, full-time faculty members have joined The Newport College - Salve Regina, it was announced today by Dr. William Burrell, vice president and dean of the faculty. This group represents the largest single increase for the College in the number of new, full-time faculty hired. Beginning the 1980-81 academic year are:

Bernard Masterson (Rumford, RI), visiting assistant professor of fine arts. Masterson has almost 25 years teaching experience in English, speech and dramatics on the secondary and college levels. He graduated from Providence College and holds an M.A. in Education-English from Brown University. Masterson is known for founding and directing the popular Young People's School for the Performing Arts.

Sister Madeleine Gregoire, D.H.S., to chairman of the Department of Mathematics and assistant professor of mathematics. Sister Madeleine was assistant professor of mathematics at Annhurst College (Ammhurst, MA).

She earned her M.A. and Ph.D. in mathematics from Catholic University of America and is a member of the Association for Computing Machinery and American Mathematical Society.

James C. Farrington (Newport, RI), appointed assistant professor of criminal justice. Formerly with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Farrington was responsible for administration and supervision of the agent-attorneys in the Legal Counsel division. Previously, Farrington prepared guidelines related to the Freedom of Information Act and Privacy Act. He has lectured extensively at the FBI National Academy and is a member of the Criminal Justice Committee of the American Bar Association. An alumnus of the University of New Hampshire, Farrington earned his J.D. at Boston College.

Paul R. Pacheco (New Bedford, MA), to assistant professor of accounting. A graduate of Bryant College, Pacheco holds an M.B.A. from Southeastern Massachusetts University. Previously, he served as instructor of accounting and management at Rhode Island College and has been a financial analyst for a number of corporations.

Gilbert R. Green (Newport, RI), to assistant professor of management. Green holds a B.B.A. from Western Michigan University and an M.B.A. from American University. Green was named a distinguished graduate of the Newport Naval War College and taught management there.

Joining the nursing department as instructor of nursing is Joan Chapdelaine (Newport, RI). A graduate of Salve Regina, Joan also holds an M.S. in nursing from Boston University. Previously she was oncology nursing coordinator for the Rhode Island Cancer Control program and director of nursing at Truesdale Hospital, Fall River. She has also served as clinical coordinator and instructor of nursing at Newport Hospital School of Nursing.

Kathryn Flood (Portsmouth, RI), appointed instructor of special education. She holds a B.S. from the University of Cincinnati and an M.Ed. from Xavier

University (Cincinnati). She served as a visiting instructor at Miami University of Ohio and has taught in the Cincinnati Public Schools.

Sister Elizabeth McAuliffe, instructor of education. A Salve graduate Sister Elizabeth earned a Master of Science in Teaching (chemistry) from the University of New Hampshire. She was principal of Bishop Gerrard High School in Fall River from 1975-1980.

Appointed Assistant Professor of French and English is Sister Theresa McQueeney, S.N.D. She received her A.B. from Emmanuel College, M.A. from Assumption, and Ph.D. in French/Linguistics from Georgetown University. She has taught English as a second language at Annhurst College, St. Mary of the Woods in Indiana and N.D. Seishin University in Ikayama, Japan.

Sister Leona Misto, R.S.M., instructor of mathematics. A Salve graduate, Sister Leona holds an M.A. in mathematics from Rhode Island College and a Master's in religious studies from Providence College. She served as director of education for SS Peter and Paul Parish in Fall River and director of spirituality for the Sisters of Mercy, Province of Providence. Sister Leona taught at Bishop Feehan High School, St. Xavier Academy, St. Mary's Academy, and has served on the executive committee of the National Association of Parish Coordinators and Directors.

Ann Pelletier (Portsmouth, RI), appointed instructor in Spanish. A graduate of William and Mary College, she earned her M.A. at the University of Madrid. While in Spain she worked at the U.S. Information Agency, was a writer and announcer for national radio, and taught English on national television. She worked at St. Philomena School and taught English as a second language at Portsmouth Abbey. Among her publications is Shopping in Spain--Fodor's Modern Guide to Spain and Portugal.

Marjorie Roblin (Providence, RI), instructor of sociology. She holds a B.S., and an M.S.S. in Social Work and Social Research from Bryn Mawr College. In addition to private practice in family counseling, Roblin served as a social worker for the Justice Services Division of the Episcopal Community Services in Philadelphia, and Prevention and Intervention Specialist with Shalom, Inc. of the Diocese of Philadelphia.
