Caroline Salvatore, to instruct psychology. Salvatore recently completed doctoral requirements in psychology from the University of Rhode Island. She holds an M.A. and B.A. in psychology from URI, and has been instructing part-time at several area colleges including URI and Salve;

Dr. Jerome Montvilo, to instruct biology. Montvilo holds a Ph.D. in biology from Fordham University, and prior to his appointment was a research assistant in the anatomy department for Tufts University School of Medicine.
