DANCE MARATHONERS AT SALVE REGINA - THE NEWPORT COLLEGE COLLECT MORE THAN \$3,400 FOR AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY

Students, faculty and staff of Salve Regina - The Newport College collected more than \$3,400 in pledges for the American Cancer Society as a result of its 20-hour dance marathon held November 13 and 14 in Ochre Court.
