RESIDENTIAL WORKSHOP FOCUSES ON EXPLORING LIFE
BY LOOKING THROUGH DEATH

A residential workshop, "Explore Your Life by Looking Through Death," will be held Friday, March 5, through Sunday, March 7, at the Stone House Club in Little Compton, Rhode Island.

The weekend workshop will discuss people's conscious and unconscious attitudes about death, and how these attitudes shape their lives. Through discussion, visualization, drawing, body movement and gestalt, participants will use the idea of death to focus more clearly on life priorities.

The workshop will be conducted by Poldi Orlando and Dr. Jack Childs, F.S.C. Orlando is a gestalt and movement therapist and is on the training staff of the Gestalt Therapy Institute of Florida. She is a member of the Forum for Death Education and Counseling.

Dr. Childs is an associate professor of Human Development at Salve Regina - The Newport College. He holds a doctorate in counselor education and has trained extensively with the Gestalt Therapy Institute. Childs has previously conducted workshops at conventions of the Association for Humanistic Psychology.

Cost for the workshop is \$140 which includes sleeping accommodations and meals. Registration is limited and a \$50 deposit is required by February 19 from all individuals wishing to participate.
