SUPERINTENDENT OF NEWPORT SCHOOLS TO CONDUCT SALVE REGINA COLLEGE WORKSHOP ON ISSUES IN EDUCATION

Dr. Vincent Trainor, superintendent of Newport schools, will conduct a graduate-level workshop, "Contemporary Issues in Education," July 12-23, from 8:30 a.m. to noon at Salve Regina - The Newport College.

The three-credit course, offered by Salve's graduate studies office, will meet Monday through Friday in O'Hare Academic Center.

Trainor, a native of Pawtucket, holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from Rhode Island College and a Ph.D. from the University of Connecticut. He was superintendent of schools in Thompson, Conn. for five years before coming to Newport in 1974, and has almost 20 years teaching experience at the high school and college levels.

As superintendent of Newport schools, Trainor is responsible for eight schools, employing more than 500 administrators, teachers and staff.

Since entering the field of education, Trainor has seen many educational issues change and develop, such as a dramatic drop in federal funds, a decline in student population, and a "back to basics" movement. In the Salve two-week workshop, participants will select many of these same issues for in-depth analysis. Additional topics for study include vouchers, censorship and a decline in SAT scores.
