HISTORICAL STRUCTURES OF NEWPORT FOCUS OF THIS YEAR'S "EDUCATION VIA RADIO"

The Old Burying Grounds on Newport's Farewell Street which contains one of the finest collections of 17th century stonecuttings in New England, will be the subject of this Wednesday's (October 13) "Education via Radio" program on WADK, AM radio 1540. Edwin W. Connelly, part-time instructor at Salve Regina - The Newport College, will be the guest speaker. The program will air from 9 to 10 a.m.; WADK host is Freddie Fernandez.

This year, "Education via Radio," sponsored by Salve in cooperation with WADK, will focus on historical Newport structures. Landmarks to be discussed in upcoming weeks by local experts from the College and community include the Newport Casino, Vinlands estate, the Inn at Castle Hill and Colony House.

In 1980, the program began with Newport perspectives, a look at the history and culture of colorful Newport.
