

Letter from Mr. Samson to Mr. Goëlet, London
Paris, 22d of June, 1883

Your letter from the 21st is in my hands.

Actually, I had the pleasure of seeing Mr. Allard last Tuesday on your behalf.

For the five tapestries you saw at my house, I had given him the price of 58000 francs. Nevertheless, although this price leaves me a minimal profit, I accept the 55000 francs you propose me, and I point out you are getting a great deal.

Consequently I consider the deal closed and I'm going to make the repairs as agreed, in order to satisfy you entirely.

Please tell me the means of delivery and the method of payment you wish.
