

Letter from Dasson to Mrs. Goëlet, Hotel Bristol  
Paris, June 18<sup>th</sup>, 1886

Dear Madame,

We have the honor to address you the prices for different objects you noticed in our showroom.

1 mantelpiece garniture, 5 pieces, comprising 3 Chinese vases and 2 cornet-vases, in old blue-ground and gilded china: 3500 francs

1 pair of sconces, Louis XV style, 7 lights, for gas: 2600 f.

1 small Louis XV table, satinwood, marquetry: 900 f.

1 Louis XV style chest, with caryatids, inlaid panels, marble top

Height: 1.40 m. width: 1.40 m.: 5000 f.

1 Louis XV style chest, 4 panels in modern *vernis Martin*

Height: 1.30 m. width: 1m.: 4500 f.

1 Louis XV style inlaid side table, with tablets and drawers [?]: 1100 f.

1 Louis XVI style chest with inlaid little rosettes: 5000 f.

Moreover, there is the pair of Louis XV girandoles made in serpentin marble, which you already set aside, and whose price is 1800 francs.

Tomorrow morning you will be given the photographs of the Louis XVI showcases, and Monday morning we will have the honor to see you at your hotel.
